Drawing on the Buddhist concept of impermanence, it explores the contradiction between individuality and mortality created by the passage of time. The traditional view of the relationship between portraiture and time, is that portraits endure while their subjects grow older and ultimately die. The distinction of *Life Goes On Within You And Without You* is that the artist has introduced an element of time into the portraits themselves.
